ALAMIS - MEMBERSHIP

Have you heard the news; Units can pay their memberships on-line?

Here is the scoop if you are interested. First and foremost, to use the ALAMIS system your Unit must have a debit or credit card for paying the dues! If you have that then you need to request this on a National form thru the Department of Minnesota office. I have enclosed the form in this unit mailing.

There is a fee for this service, and it is billed annually and runs on a calendar year. As of January 1, 2023, the fee structure is going to change to the following:

Unit Full Access (i.e. can pay dues) - \$20.00 per user

Unit write access (address and profile changes only) - \$15.00 per user

Unit view only - \$10.00 per user

UNITS CAN HAVE UP TO 2 USERS

District view only - \$10.00 Once again, these prices go into effect January 2023. Once the form is received in the office, verified, and entered into ALAMIS and is set up you will be sent an email and you will take a tutorial on to use ALAMIS. Once that is completed you are on your way.

You can change your user's by sending in a change form and the annual fee will be billed to you each year by the department office.

What is Americanism?

According to the 1925 Americanism Commission of the American Legion - "Americanism is a term of vast, significance. In its large conception, it embraces every phase of an individual's relation to the community, state, and nation."

American Commission of 1930 – "Primarily, Americanism begins in the home. Only when one understands and appreciates and shows willingness to preserve the ideals and traditions of American home life at his own fireside will he fully discharge his obligations as a citizen."

Americanism Defined in the Americanism Handbook of the Sons of the American Legion:

Americanism is the love of America; loyalty to her institutions as the best yet devised by man to secure life, liberty, individual dignity, and happiness; and the willingness to defend our country and flag against all enemies, foreign and domestic.

It is a vital, active, living force. Americanism means peace, strength, the will, and the courage to live as free men in a free land. It means a friendly hand to people everywhere who respect our institutions and our thinking. It is not a word; it is a cause, a way of life – the best way of life ever known – a challenge and a hope in this world.

Americanism is an ideal of loyal patriotism, religious tolerance, righteous freedom, fearless courage, honest integrity, abiding faith in the commanding destiny of the United States, and a fathomless love for the principles that led our forefathers to found this country. It is complete and unqualified loyalty to the ideals of government as set forth in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States. It is respect for, and ready obedience to, duly constituted authority and the laws of the land. It is freedom without license, religion without bigotry, charity without bias, and a desire to secure the blessings of liberty for our nation and for our posterity.

What does the American Legion Auxiliary say?

The American Legion Auxiliary Unit Guide says the purpose of the national Americanism program is to promote patriotism and responsible citizenship. The Americanism work of the Auxiliary includes all activities that strengthen American ideals and uphold the principles of democracy. The security of America lies in citizens who have a true understanding, love for those ideals and principles upon which the nation was founded, and a willingness to perform these duties even at great personal sacrifice. The work of the Americanism program is educationally based and divided into three phases: work with youth, work with adults, and work within the community. All matters about the flag or patriotic education are rightly classified as Americanism activities.

As an American Legion Auxiliary member, how would you answer the following question?

"What kind of an American am I?"

Let us show how we, as American Legion Auxiliary members, are proud of our patriotism. We can do this by remembering or honoring our fellow Americans on the following patriotic days in September.

Patriots Day - September 11

In the United States, Patriot Day occurs on September 11 of each year in memory of the people killed in the September 11 attacks of the year 2001.

Those we lost September 11, 2001, will forever hold a cherished place in our hearts and in the history of our nation. By a joint resolution approved December 18, 2001, (Public Law 107-89), Congress authorized the President to designate September 11 of each year as "Patriot Day" to perpetuate the memory of those who perished in the attack on America, and to pursue peace and justice in the world and security at home. Appropriate ceremonies and activities include a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 a.m. EDT, remembrance services and candlelight vigils. Flags should be flown at half-staff on Patriot Day.

POW/MIA Recognition Day - September 15

POW/MIA Recognition Day honors the commitments and the sacrifices made by our nation's prisoners of war and those who are still missing in action. National POW/MIA Recognition Day is one of the six days specified by law on which the black POW/MIA flag shall be flown over federal facilities and cemeteries, post offices and military installations. By custom, it is on the third Friday in September.

US Constitution Day – September 17

This day commemorates the formation and signing of the U.S. Constitution on September 17, 1787 by 39 delegates to the Constitutional Convention. This document established the framework of our government and the rights and freedoms that "We the People" enjoy today. In 1940, Congress designated the third Sunday in May as "I am an American Day." In 1944, "I am an American Day" was promoted by the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service. On February 29, 1952, Congress moved "I am an American Day" observation to September 17 and renamed it "Citizenship Day." In 2004, Congress renamed the holiday "Constitution Day and Citizenship Day" and mandated that all publicly-funded educational institutions and all federal agencies provide educational programming on the history of the American Constitution on this day.

Gold Star Mother's/Family's Day - September 24

Gold Star Mother's/Family's Day honors mothers and families who have lost a service member in the line of duty or in support of military activities. The name comes from the custom of families hanging Service Flags in the window of their homes. The Service Flag has a star for each family member in the armed forces. A blue star represents a family member in active-duty service, a silver star represents a family member wounded or injured in a war zone and a gold star represents a family member killed during active-duty and stands for sacrifice made for honor and freedom. The American Gold Star Mothers, Inc. was founded shortly after World War I by Grace Darling Seibold, who lost her son, George Vaughn Seibold, during the war. Gold Star Mothers are often socially active, but are non-political. Gold Star Mother's Day was designated by Congress on June 23, 1936. In September 2012, President Barack Obama rededicated the last Sunday in September as "Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day."

The Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) is a national grant assistance program that provides temporary emergency assistance to eligible members of the American Legion Auxiliary who have endured a significant financial setback as the result of an act of nature or another personal crisis. Members helping members — that's the American Legion Auxiliary's mission of "Service Not Self in Action".

Hard times can fall upon us at any moment. That's when the American Legion Auxiliary is committed to help.

AEF was established in 1969. Five decades later, the AEF is still helping fellow Auxiliary members get back on their feet. Since the Auxiliary Emergency Fund was established, more than \$6 million has been awarded to more than 6,500 members.

Learn more at <u>AEF@ALAforVeterans.org</u>. **Applications are now only processed online at <u>www.mnala.org</u>**. Go to forms for the ALA Emergency Fund Application.

Temporary assistance is considered under the follow guidelines:

- Members whose dues are current and have maintained their dues for three consecutive years are eligible to apply. One grant per grantee in a 12-month period will be awarded.
- ✓ Natural disasters or weather emergencies leave a member without shelter or food.
 - Financial crisis hits leaving a member without resources for shelter, food, or utilities, and there is no source of assistance available.
- ✓ Extreme circumstances: educational training who is lacking the necessary skills for employment.
- ✓ Maximum award is \$2,400 on a case-by-case basis.
- ✓ Funds cannot be used for medical expenses or debts such as credit cards.
- ✓ The grant committee directs payments to a provider such as a utility or mortgage company.

American Legion Auxiliary Minnesota Girls State

After President Sharon asked me to be the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Minnesota Girls State Program Chairman, I contacted the Girls State Director to see if I could attend the 2023 session and she said, "Yes". It was quite a week. We were there to teach our students, but I learned a lot. I was a counselor in one of the cities – go Bass.

This annual week is such an opportunity for students and as American Legion Auxiliary units, we can offer students a week of learning and fun. Sponsoring a youth is a chance for our units to encourage our youth to become good citizens - citizens that care about their community, state, and nation — just like our preamble states. They have the opportunity to embrace the week to learn about our government, participate in elections (both as a candidate or supporter). They also participate at the State Capitol in either House and State Chambers or in a mock trial in a State Courtroom. They put on a talent show and this past year, they produced skits on game shows.

Your ALA MN Girls State committee recently held their first meeting. You might think that it is too early to start planning the 2024 week, but you are wrong.

First, you are probably planning your year and more importantly, your budget. Please budget to send at least one student to Girls State – maybe more. The registration fee will remain at \$300 per student. If your normal budget doesn't have room for a sponsorship, consider holding a fundraiser just for this purpose. Advertise it as a fundraiser to send someone to Girls State. Ask a past Girl Stater to be there to answer questions. Put up a tri-fold about the week. Walmart has a smaller bi-fold available. You can use it as a bi-fold or cut it in half, do two posters, putting one in your hall and one at your local school.

Second, I would ask all units to consider holding an information meeting for the junior students in your community. Invite them and their parents to learn more about the program. Serve them pizza or Sloppy Joes and chips — everyone likes food. Again, ask your past Girl Staters to attend to answer questions. I found that most parents, along with the students, didn't have any idea what the program involved. WE NEED TO CHANGE THIS! Don't forget to use your local papers for articles on the program. If you sent someone in 2023, get their picture in your paper.

Lastly, I would suggest that you find someone in your unit that has a HUGE interest in the youth of your community. Ask them to be your unit chairman. We want our units involved in choosing the right student for this program.

Over the next few months, the newsletter will provide more information to help you work through the process. Please contact us with your questions or how we can help. There were close to 200 students at Bethel College this year. Prior to Covid, the numbers were closer to 400. We need to move our numbers up to give more students this experience.

- What ways are you honoring your veteran's in your post?

This new year, as members of the American Legion Auxiliary, we will continue to support the legislative priorities of the American Legion.

Did you know that in 2019 the American Legion Auxiliary was invited to attend the Minnesota Commanders Task Force and have representation as an ex-officio non-voting member in support of our veterans?

The Minnesota Commanders Task Force, created in 1988, is comprised of nine congressionally chartered veterans service organizations. The elected leaders of these organizations meet monthly to discuss and advocate for veteran legislative needs.

They have three stated purposes which include a unified Minnesota Veterans Legislative agenda document for state and federal legislators and to represent and act as a single voice at the Capitol, to act as an advisory board to the Minnesota Commissioner of Veterans Affairs, and to work as a unified veterans leadership team when establishing veterans programs to form partnerships in the rollout and execution of new programs when possible.

As the Legislation Chairman I am the ex-officio member and represent the American Legion Auxiliary. The first meeting of the year was held in August to start compiling and reviewing the 2024 legislative priorities. Once these priorities are voted on, I will share in a unit mailing. I will be attending these meetings monthly and sharing what I can with members.

 Provides a \$5 bill to all veterans in the 12 VA facilities for personal use.
- Gift Shop Provides gift to hospitalized veterans, nursing home residents and their families during the holiday season.
- Fisher House A home away from home for spouses or families with a loved one receiving care in a major VA medical facility. Donations cover support supplies, food, personal hygiene items and other special needs for the families.
- Overall Support of the Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Program Supports all activities we do in the VA&R program.

Sponsored in conjunction with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), the American Legion Auxiliary, and Help Hospitalized Veterans, the National Veterans Creative Arts

Festival is a week-long event that showcases the creative achievements of veterans receiving treatment at VA facilities. Participation is open to any veteran enrolled at a VA Medical Center, an outpatient clinic or living in a state veterans' home. Veterans who participate in the Creative Arts Festival at their local facility are afforded an opportunity to qualify for the National Festival. The National Creative Arts Festival recognizes progress and recovery through recreation therapy and raises the visibility of the creative achievements of our nation's veteran after disease, disability, or life crisis. Approximately 140 medal winning veterans are asked to participate at the national Creative Arts Festival each year. Veterans participate in many mediums, including visual arts, such as painting, sculpting, and drawing. They also participate through creative writing, dance, drama, and music.

The Department of MN ALA has a fund available for participants in the Minnesota Veterans Creative Festival. We are not asking for donations for this fund at the present time, but we are working with the VA Hospital Medical Centers to assist area veterans to apply for grant money from this fund. This fund allows grants to veterans for artistic kits, paint, pens, pencils, performing arts costuming, leather, or music. This fund may also assist with clothing and funds for other expenses to compete in the Veterans Creative Arts Festival. Veterans must

apply for this assistance. If you know of a veteran interested in participating the MN Veterans Creative Arts Festival and they have a specific need, encourage them to apply for this grant.

The local Minnesota Veterans Creative Arts Festival offers many opportunities for Auxiliary members to volunteer. Contact your local facility Recreation Therapist for more information and the dates of their festival.
