February is Americanism Month; however, Americanism is used all year round!

Presidents Day will be observed on Monday, Feb. 19, 2024

What can you do to promote Americanism in your schools and communities? Contact your schools, Boys Scout, Girls Scouts, Home School Co-op, or other youth organizations. Ask to promote respect for the flag, proper flag etiquette and appropriate flag retirement to our youth and community members.

Units can also promote the Americanism Essay. The Americanism Essay title this year is "What does Freedom mean to me?" The deadline for returning the Americanism Essay Contest is getting closer. The Unit will choose their winner and will send that submission to me on or before March 25th. Please make sure that the National Cover Sheet is completed and attached to the submitted essay. No late submissions will be accepted.

American Flag Myths

The Flag Code is The American Legion Flag Code.

On Flag Day, June 14, 1923, The American Legion and representatives of 68 other patriotic, fraternal, civic and military organizations met in Washington, DC for the purpose of drafting a code of flag etiquette. The 77th Congress adopted this codification of rules as public law on June 22, 1942. It is Title 4, United States Code Chapter 1.

A flag that has been used to cover a casket cannot be used for any other proper display purpose.

A flag that has been used to cover a casket can be used for any proper display purpose to include displaying this flag from a staff or flagpole.

You must destroy the flag when it touches the ground.

As long as the flag remains suitable for display, the flag may continue to be displayed as a symbol of our great country.

The Flag Code prohibits the washing or dry-cleaning of the flag.

There are no provisions of the Flag Code, which prohibit the washing or dry-cleaning of the flag. The decision to wash or dry-clean would of course depend upon the type of material.

The mayor, a town official, or the Post Commander can order the flag to be displayed at half-staff.

The gesture of placing the flag at half-staff means that the Nation or the state mourns the death of a highly regarded National or state figure, hence only the President of the United States or the Governor of the state may order the Flag to be half-staffed in accordance with Flag Code section 7(m). Those individuals and agencies that usurp authority and display the flag at half-staff on inappropriate occasions are quickly eroding the honor and reverence accorded this solemn act.

Children Welfare Foundation

Was developed in 1954 to help contribute to the betterment of children in this country. It is to help with the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual well-being of children and youth. Grants are given to nonprofit organizations for research, programs, and activities for the welfare and well-being of children and youth. National Auxiliary Liaison Linda Newsome has challenged each Auxiliary Unit to donate \$1 per member to the Child Welfare Foundation.

Legionville

I wanted to take some time and give you a little information on Legionville. This is such a great program that the Department of Minnesota American Legion Family offers to the youth in this state. This information came from Carl Moon the President of Legionville and I want to thank him for this information.

The original camp opened in 1956 and was 560 acres with 1500 feet of shoreline along North Long Lake near Brainerd, MN. Since the camp opened over 90000 youth campers have graduated from the school crossing guard program. And there has never been an accident at a school crossing that has had a graduate of the program present. With the changing of times and some schools not using students as crossing guards they have also included other youth safety programs. They still train crossing guards but also offer water safety, CPR, bus safety, and First Aide. In the future they hope to offer 4-wheeler safety and snowmobile safety. The 2024 Camp will have 6 weekly sessions with a maximum capacity of 154 campers ages 9-13. The cost per camper is \$500. The 2024 sessions will be: June 16-21 and 23-28 July 7-12, 14-19, 21-26, and 28- Aug 2.

I have also included what the camp would like to get with donations they receive. This camp works solely based on donations and registration from campers.

Greetings and Happy New Year. We are in 2024 and the American Legion Auxiliary, Minnesota Girls State Committee is gearing up for this year's event at Bethel College on June 9-15. In fact, we recently had a zoom meeting. We are working on the daily programs, staff, speakers, and activities.

I hope that your unit has discussed sponsoring one or more junior students from your local school(s) for this educational opportunity. This is a week-long chance for them to learn about our election system, hear from speakers from all three of the branches of our government and visit the State Capitol – just to mention a few activities. All of this will make them better voters and better citizens of our great state.

This is such a learning opportunity for that student. Not only do they learn about elections, but they also learn about flag retirement, poppies, flag advancement and retiring of colors, the folding of the flag, and what the American Legion Auxiliary does.

By the time you read this, your local Superintendents and Principals should have received letters and other information. Please contact your school to be sure that the information has been passed on to a staff member that is interested in finding the right student(s) to attend. Maybe one of your Auxiliary members Is part of the school staff or someone may have a suggestion to who could help your unit.

I can't impress enough that we strongly encourage your unit to meet with all candidates. Some units meet them individually – others as a group. Visit with them, answer their questions, and ask them questions. We want you to be confident that you have chosen the right student to send to Bethel. The final decision should be yours.

There will be a maximum of 200 spots for our students this year. We encourage you to complete the reservation form (included in this unit mailing) and get it sent to the Department office. The deadline will be March 31st or until all 200 spots are filled. No reservations will be taken after we have 200 students.

American Legion Auxiliary Minnesota Girls State

The 77th session of American Legion Auxiliary Minnesota Girls State will be held June 9-15, 2024, at Bethel University in Arden Hills. The ALA MN Girls State citizens will arrive on Sunday and leave on Saturday morning before noon. The ALA MN Girls State committee has made the decision to keep attendance to 200 participants for the 2024 session.

The school mailing to principals was mailed in January. The schools are aware that units will be contacting them to set up an appointment to meet with potential candidates from the Junior High School class to attend the 2024 ALA MN Girls State session. *Please read all the information we have provided so that you are aware of the eligibility and qualifications required.*

2024 eligibility updated to include MN ALA junior members living out of state and meeting all other criteria.

There is **no** limit to the number of girls a Unit may sponsor to ALA Minnesota Girls State.

The registration fee remains at \$300 per citizen for the 2024 session. If there are no high schools in your community, please consider sponsoring or co-sponsoring a girl(s) from the Junior class in a neighboring community.

What can your Unit do to raise funds to send a girl to Minnesota Girls State? Here are a few suggestions:

- ✓ Units may hold different types of fundraising events
- ✓ Charitable Gambling funds may be used for the reservation fee only.

 If gambling funds used make checks payable to: American Legion Auxiliary Foundation.
- ✓ Donations can be received from local businesses and/or community organizations.
- ✓ Their checks need to be made out to your Unit and then your Unit sends a check to the Department office for the reservation fee.
- ✓ Ask your American Legion Post or Sons of The American Legion Squadron to sponsor a girl or girls by writing a check to the American Legion Auxiliary.

A resolution, passed at the 2011 Department Convention, states that monies sent to the Department Office for reservations not used to sponsor a girl to ALA Minnesota Girls State would be placed into a <u>Girls State Reservation Fee Fund</u>. This fund is available for any unit to use **one time every 3 years on a first come-first serve basis.** If your Unit has a girl who is interested in attending and you do not have enough funds to reserve a place for her, consider applying to the Department Office in writing to request these funds.

All reservations are due by <u>March 31st</u> accompanied by your check. Once your Unit has submitted your reservation and payment of \$300.00 per girl, you will be sent a Registration Packet. This packet will be sent to the name listed on the Reservation Form. The paperwork included in this packet has due dates listed which must be followed. It is important that you read the Registration Packet thoroughly before you share it with your citizen. Please remember there are NO late arrivals and NO early dismissals. The 2024 Girls State session begins promptly at 3:00 pm on Sunday, June 9th and ends on Saturday morning June 15, 2024.

The name(s) and email address of your girl(s) are due to the Department office by <u>May 1, 2024</u>. Our contract with Bethel University requires that we commit to a final number of reservations for citizens and staff on that date, so the deadline is very important.

The ALA Minnesota Girls State Committee has been working diligently to ensure that our citizens have a truly memorable week at ALA Minnesota Girls State. We look forward to welcoming a participant representing your unit and community.



Military OneSource is the 24/7 connection to information for all members of the military family. They are eligible to use this Defense Department-funded program anytime, anywhere. They can turn to Military OneSource for tax services, spouse employment help, webinars and online training, relocation, and deployment tools, and more. They do not provide any advertising or promotional services on their website. All commercial organizations that are listed on the site have an official agreement or contract with the Office of Military Community & Family Policy. They also recommend trying to contact some of the larger veteran service organizations & military service organizations to find out how you might work together to target the desired population.

Military OneSource can help by providing information—how to get new ID cards, how to get copies of military service records, how to find certain benefits, programs, and allowances such as Caregiver Support Services, Building Healthy Relationships, Everyday Commissary Savings, Education Specialty Consults, and Elder Care Specialty Consults.

This program was specifically designed by the Defense Department for service members, military family members and survivors. The app streamlines their online experience with one-touch navigation & fast 24/7 access to military benefits, military life experts and MilLife guides.

There is also a link on the Public Relations Committee page for a Public Relations Toolkit which you will find very helpful.



<u>Credit Memo Notification</u> <u>Time Shortened</u>





- Incomplete member applications, i.e. unmarked Veteran Served and Anytime After section. unmarked living or deceased. Applicant's Relationship to the Veteran, unsigned by the applicant or the post adjutant/officers.
