# The Americanism Program in the American Legion Auxiliary Promoting Patriotism and Community Engagement: January Projects

#### Introduction

The American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) has long been committed to fostering patriotism, civic responsibility, and democratic values among citizens. One of its key initiatives, the Americanism Program, seeks to instill appreciation for American ideals, encourage active citizenship, and honor those who serve our nation. # 3. Promote the Americanism Essay Contest

The cover sheet is on the Department website and must be signed by a teacher. Due to Department Americanism Chair before March 26<sup>th</sup>. Essay Title: "Celebrating America's 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday and the Veterans who Fought for Our Freedom."

# 4. Citizenship and Voting Awareness Campaign

Begin an awareness campaign about the importance of citizenship and voting. Create informative displays at local events, distribute voter registration information, and encourage eligible community members to register to vote. This is especially timely in presidential election years or during local election cycles.

# 5. Care Packages for Deployed Service Members

Organize a drive to collect items for care packages to send to deployed military personnel. Items like snacks, toiletries, and handwritten notes of encouragement go a long way in boosting morale and showing appreciation for their service.

#### 6. Americanism Education in Schools

Partner with local schools to present lessons or activities on American history, the Constitution, and the responsibilities of citizenship. Offer to provide guest speakers or materials, and encourage schools to incorporate Americanism themes into January classroom activities.



# What is it?

ALA Minnesota Girls State is a diverse group of young women who share a common desire to learn. From small towns to urban areas, the citizens' diverse backgrounds add spirit to the program. The purposes of the ALA Minnesota Girls State program is to provide Americanism and good citizenship training, and to inform our participants about the duties, privileges, rights and responsibilities of government as practiced in a democratic society.



ALA Minnesota Girls State "Citizens" study the Minnesota city, county, and state governmental processes. Citizens are divided into two fictional political parties gaining knowledge of the operations of a two-party system. They formulate their cities electing the officials and then proceed to elect county and state government officials.

Activities include political party campaigning, caucusing, debating, and voting.
Parliamentary procedures are also used in the processes. We are proud to feature a variety of speakers during the week. Past speakers have included: Mayor of White Bear Lake Jo Emerson, Stearns County Attorney Janelle Kendall, State Auditor Julie Blaha, Secretary of State Steve Simon, and Minnesota Governor Tim Walz, as well as Gold Star families, veterans, and first generation Americans.

# Requirements

- She must have completed her junior year of high school in a Minnesota public, charter, home school, parochial or private school or be a resident of Minnesota and have at least one more semester remaining prior to graduation
- She must demonstrate an interest in American government and have a high scholastic rank. She must have high moral character with strong leadership abilities
- She must be a citizen of the U.S. or have legal residency
- She must have no marital status (National ALA Mandate)
- She must not have attended any other ALA Girls State session
- She must be physically healthy and able to live independently

To develop leadership and pride as American citizens, to educate citizens about our system of government, to instill a greater understanding of Americanism, and to stimulate a desire to maintain our democratic government processes

Only Junior Members will be allowed to speak on the Conference floor. Please remember that Senior members are advisors only and this is the Juniors Conference. Juniors will be seated by District with one advisor per District. If space allows one advisor per Unit may also sit with the Juniors. The District Junior Activities Chairman will be the Senior Advisor for her District if she is present.

# Eligibility to hold office (Standing Rules)

- 1. No officer shall succeed herself in the same office.
- 2. Any Junior officer must be classified as a junior member the year she holds office.

## **Endorsements**

Endorsements for Department Honorary Junior Officers shall be sent to the Department Office as soon as possible. Donations are used to ensure that every veteran residing in the ten VA Homes and VA Medical Centers receives a cash gift on Valentine's Day.

# **ALA Dept of MN Scholarship Fund**

Up to eight \$1,000 scholarships are awarded each year. These scholarships are available to the sons, daughters, and grandchildren of veterans who are residents of Minnesota. Funding for this program is made possible through the generous donations we receive.

# ALA Dept of MN Hospital Program (includes VA & R Program)

The American Legion Auxiliary Hospital Program uses donations to provide personal care items for VA Hospital patients and fund events and activities organized by Department Hospital Representatives at twelve MN VA Homes and Hospitals.

# **Armed Forces Center - Mpls Airport**

The Center offers traveling military personnel a place to rest with food, beverages, beds, and toiletries. Open 24/7 and staffed by volunteers, it provides comfort between flights and is funded entirely by donations.

Criteria for eligibility is established by the Board of Trustee and published in the American Legion Family Hospital Association Operational Manual.

Financial Assistance ~ Financial assistance is available to all eligible members of the association for payment of medical bills incurred for services provided by any duly licensed hospital or medical practitioner provided the need for financial assistance has been determined. Before applying for aid, veterans should take advantage of the services offered them by the government at Veterans Hospitals. The member's dependents should make all possible use of other available medical assistance programs.

Exceptions ~ The Association does not pay for transportation to and from the hospital (unless by ambulance), hotelmotel bills for anyone accompanying a patient unless an attendant is deemed necessary and authorized by the association, telephone bills incurred by the patient, personal service, dental work, eye wear, or hearing aids. The association does not give aid in the nature of a loan or pay credit card charges.

# **Procedure** ~ the applicant should:

- 1. Contact the Service Officer of the local Post or the County Veterans Service Officer in their area to obtain an application blank.
- 2. Complete the application.
- 3. Copies of final medical bills must be provided.
