

URGENT NOTICE

Greetings to all Department Officers, District Presidents, District AEF Chairman, Units and members.

Just to let you know that there have been some major changes in the AEF program effective October 1, 2023.

This is the information that I received from National last week.

- The National Executive Committee (NEC) approved an increase for the Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) grants in February. The new grant amount took effect at the beginning of the 2024 fiscal year, Oct. 1. The updated grant award is \$3,000 for ALA members who have been affected by a natural disaster or other crisis and need urgent financial assistance.
- The increase from \$2,400 to \$3,000 is a result of the rising cost of living and inflation. These rising costs impact millions of Americans, making it increasingly difficult for them to attain economic security. In July 2023, consumer prices were 3.2% higher than the year before. This has increased the cost of goods and services, making it more difficult for families to afford their basic needs.
- The updated applications are attached and can be found on the ALA website. Please distribute them to your units so we can help as many members in need as possible. We will no longer accept outdated applications.
- If you have any questions or comments, please do not hesitate to reach out to Carley (317-569-4537. She is happy to jump on a call if anyone should need further clarification.

Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) Application Instructions for Disaster Assistance for American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) Members

An AEF grant may provide emergency assistance to ALA members in areas devastated by a natural disaster. The applicant must have received damage to the primary residence and/or been displaced/evacuated from the residence and/or had out-of-pocket expenses for temporary emergency expenses as a result of the disaster. Grants may be awarded up to \$3,000. One AEF grant per grantee will be awarded in a 12-month period.

What is a natural disaster?

A natural disaster is a major adverse event resulting from natural processes of the Earth that may produce great loss of human life or destruction of the natural environment. Any other disaster outside of this scope will need the consensus of the AEF Internal Review Committee to be considered. Examples of natural disasters include floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, volcanic eruptions, earthquakes, tsunamis, and other geologic processes.

Basic criteria for qualification

- The applicant must be a current ALA member
- Applicant must have maintained annual ALA membership for three consecutive years (the current year and immediate past two years)

Required application information

The application must be accurately and completely filled out with all necessary documentation to prevent delays in processing. Please explain in detail the damage incurred to the primary residence including interior and exterior of primary structure only, household contents/appliances and damage to vehicles from the disaster. Application must include photos of damage, full copies of receipts for emergency expenses/repairs and copy of driver's license, work estimates, and insurance claim and/or government (FEMA) documents. If the application is not complete, it may be returned for amendment, further explanation or more documentation.

Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) Application Instructions for Hardship Assistance for American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) Members

An AEF grant may provide temporary assistance to eligible members during a time of financial crisis when no other source of aid is readily available to pay for shelter, basic household utilities and/or for loss of income. Grants may be awarded up to \$3,000 with the intent to help members who have suffered a financial setback and offer a helping hand to assist in reestablishing financial stability. Funding will not be granted to pay for any expenses other than shelter, basic household utilities and/or loss of income. One AEF grant per grantee will be awarded in a 12-month period.

Basic criteria for qualification

- The applicant must be a current ALA member
- Applicant must have maintained annual ALA membership for three consecutive years (the current year and immediate past two years)

Required application information

The application must be accurately and completely filled out with all necessary documentation to prevent delays in processing. Please explain in detail your current situation/emergency. Include all current basic household utility statements, bills, eviction notices, disconnection notices, documentation on loss of income and any other expenses you wish to be considered for funding. If the application is not complete, it may be returned for amendment, further explanation or more documentation.

November 2023 **VETERANS DAY**, originally known as Armistice Day, is a federal holiday to honor military Veterans of the United States. How can we recognize and honor Veterans through community service projects?

- *Community-wide Veterans Day dinners and programs are a wonderful opportunity for all citizens in the community to recognize and honor local Veterans. Partner with other community organizations, especially other groups that support Veterans, in hosting this honorary Veterans Day observance.
- *Schools in the community can honor local Veterans by inviting the Veterans into the classroom to encourage patriotism in the youth community, to share their military experience, or to participate in a special honorary Veterans Day program.
- *Veterans Day community service projects can be aimed to support the basic needs of Veterans such as food, housing, and clothing. Purchase a bag of groceries, bake a special treat, or prepare a home cooked meal and deliver to a Veteran living alone or homebound. Contact your Post VSO to identify specific basic needs of Veterans in your area and work to meet those needs.
- *Community service projects can support other needs for Veterans in your community. Due to life circumstances, a Veteran might appreciate the offer of friendly helping hands to mow the lawn, rake and bag leaves, or shovel snow off the sidewalk or driveway. Enlist the help of your Junior Auxiliary and youth S.A.L. members, youth organizations at school, youth groups at your local place of worship, and local Scout troops.
- *Veterans Day projects can be of a social nature. Encourage your Unit members to each say a special thank you to a Veteran, make a phone call, or visit a Veteran or someone in your community that is alone or homebound. Set up an evening for your Unit to write on "thank you" cards and mail to Veterans in your community.

Greetings from the Girls State Committee by Linda Kelly

Thank you to all that attended the informational meeting about Girls State on Thursday night of Fall Conference. Members of our committee gave an overview of the week-long program. This program is a great opportunity for students to learn about our election process and the three branches of our state government. That is why this is the chance for your unit to help make this investment in our youth – our future citizens.

Budgets are always an estimate – for both the income and the expense. Our income is registration fees, donations, sale of girls-state wear, and SCRIP. All these vary every year. We watch our expenses, but we are dependent on the number of our attendees and how many of our members support the SCRIP program.

I talked at length about the SCRIP program. This is the program where over 500 businesses will pay a percentage of their gift cards we purchase back to the Department of Minnesota's Girls State program. The percentage back varies by the business.

With your participation, you can really impact our budget. The Department brought some gift cards to the Fall Conference, and we successfully sold ALL of them. That small number that we sold netted the program \$80.00 and that was just \$1500 in gift cards.

For example: It isn't often that I can leave Walmart without spending \$50. If I would purchase cards to be able to spend \$50 every week for 50 weeks out of the year, it will net the program \$62.50 and if I dine out monthly at my favorite restaurants, spending \$50 every month, it will net the program \$48.00. That is a total of \$112.50 and that's not talking about my gas purchases, gift cards for Christmas and birthdays, home repairs, and clothing and shoes. This also nets us over \$1000 for every 10 members that purchase. Think of what 100 of us can do.

Gift cards can be ordered through the Department, but the easiest way to order is online at www.raiseright.com. Use the "sign up" button to set up an account the first time you are there. You need to "join an existing account" using 2987B82859542 for Girls State. The top of the next screen will show our name and ask for your name. You will then need to fill in a username (e-mail address), password — with security questions to follow. After you have created your account and going forward, you will need your username and password to start shopping.

They also offer bonuses. I was online and Kwik Trip had increased their bonus to 9% which is almost double their normal bonus. In fact there were 33 businesses that had bonuses, with limited time.

Please take the time to set up an account, look over the bonuses, and check out the entire list of participating businesses. There is an extra charge for using a credit card to pay for the cards, but if you set up the money to come out of your checking account, there is just a small fee (cents) per card. Order some cards and test it out. You can also reload the cards after you have used the dollars. It was also mentioned that you can purchase e-cards that go directly to your phone, but I have not tried that.

We will have cards at all Rallies this year, so come prepared with check or cash. If there are certain cards that you would like, please give me a call and I will add them to the list. The Pearl Harbor Rally is December - just in time to purchase your Christmas gift cards.

We will be sending information to all High School Superintendents and Principals in mid-January. I will be sending the information that they get to all District GS Chairman and ask them to put into your newsletter so your unit will see what they are getting.



The poppy program in Minnesota is set to gain many new veteran poppy makers! I'm pleased to report that the response to the article in the Minnesota Legionnaire has been successful so far and I have received responses from veterans from across the state of Minnesota. Plans are in the works to train these individuals on how to assemble our beautiful poppy so that our supply is back to where it used to be!

Now for some important information on Poppy Funds and how our units can spend them. Please note that these are not suggestions – they are in fact rules that the American Legion national organization has made concerning poppy funds and rules that we all must follow.

Many programs of the American Legion Auxiliary require financial resources as we work our mission to meet the needs of veterans, active duty military and their families. Poppy distributions and resulting donations are vital to funding certain activities, but it is important to know how poppy funds may or may not be utilized.

Permitted Uses of Poppy Funds:

- For rehabilitation of veterans honorably discharged from the US Armed Forces after April 6, 1917
- For the welfare of the families of veterans of the above-named period
- For the rehabilitation of hospitalized military service personnel returning home and awaiting discharge who requires treatment in service hospital
- For the welfare of veterans, active military personnel, and the families of veterans and active military personnel of the above-named period where financial and medical needs are clear
- For poppy kits and supplies used to make symbolic poppies and poppy items that will be distributed for donations to the Poppy Fund
- For donations to the American Legion Auxiliary Foundation for benefit of the National Veterans
 Creative Arts Festival
- For supporting local or National Honor Flights
- For supporting the Armed Services YMCA (ASYMCA) to combat food insecurity experienced by our service members and their families.



For further clarification, Poppy funds CANNOT be used for:

- Any general operating fund of a department, unit, or post
- Any community service project not directly benefitting the welfare of an individual veteran/military servicemember or the welfare of his/her family
- General maintenance, enhancement or improvement projects of American Legion or Auxiliary facilities, including adding ramp(s) to a post home
- Investments, even those that would bring profit to the unit or post
- POW/MIA programs
- Memberships, including other veteran support organizations such as Gold Star Mothers
- Contributions to, or payouts from, the Auxiliary Emergency Fund
- ALA Girls State/ALA Girls Nation fees
- Flags or flagpoles
- Scholarships which do not restrict eligibility solely to military servicemembers or their children, or where the financial need is not clear
- Mileage, travel, or lodging expenses; registration of conference fees; or costs incurred by a
 person-- including ALA members, volunteers, and staff--to attend any meeting, conference, or
 event about veterans
- Attire or uniforms used by volunteers or staff in promoting or conducting ALA program activity or business

Use of poppy funds is allowable for care packages ONLY when it is for a welfare need, such as first aid topical treatment or 86 American Legion Auxiliary Unit Guide vital hygiene items, as opposed to comfort needs, such as leisure items like baked goods or books.

Because of the restrictions on allowable uses of poppy funds, it is important that Units or Departments provide proper accounting in order to separate poppy monies from any other asset or source of funds.

Past President Parley November 2023

Units are encouraged to establish a Past President's Parley. This may be done on the district level also. The Parley is a group of past Unit, District or Dept. Presidents. These Parleys mentor and educate current or new members and officers, or members seeking offices. Help the meetings move toward a positive conclusion. Welcome new members also.

Past Presidents Parley has an annual Health Care Scholarship for the Medical Fields. There are so many different avenues the medical field entails these days, so please review what all this scholarship may include as far as medical occupations. Rules and Regulations for 2023-2024 as well as applications will be available on the Dept website.

Again, this year the Past President Parley program will be offering the Kienholz Walker Plaque Dept Award. Award criteria is as follows; The Unit submitting the best narrative on the activities the Unit's Past President Parley has done. These PPP's must be in existence prior to 2023. Award Guidelines: Entry must be typewritten in narrative format, not to exceed 1,000 words. The entry may include no more than five pictures and news articles. Again, the parley must be in existence prior to 2023.

This year a new initiative is in place for Unit's to organize a Past President's Parley. I have challenged the 10 District Presidents, to organize five new Past President's Parley's in their Districts. A \$50.00 gift card will be awarded at the Dept Convention, to the first District President to accomplish that. Criteria for this is:

- 1. Phone number of the President of that Unit with a new PPP (Past President's Parley) must be provided to me so I can call and verify it is a new Parley.
- 2. The new PPP must organize a clothing drive, a food drive, or a school supply drive before the Dept Convention. Pictures and results should be shared with me.

Please help your District President out with this challenge. Please check the PPP page in the Unit Guidebook for tips on organizing these fun and useful organizations. Contribute to the PPP for the Annual Healthcare Scholarship also.
