The Auxiliary Minnesota Disaster Fund was created to provide:

- Temporary assistance to eligible members during a time of financial crisis. It is designed to help with a financial need when a disaster happens
- A Disaster will be of a Natural nature, such as Flood, Tornado, Wild Fire, etc.
- This fund is designed for Minnesota Unit members only.
- The Disaster Fund maintains the confidentiality of all applications, reviews, and supporting documents, and will neither disclose nor release disaster files or cases to anyone outside of the ALA Minnesota Disaster Fund Committee.

Eligibility: Persons who have been members of the American Legion Auxiliary for at least the immediate past two consecutive years. AND whose current membership dues are paid at the time the disaster occurs (three consecutive years' dues) may apply for assistance.

Assistance Provided: The maximum grant amount is \$2,500.00 to be disbursed from the Minnesota Disaster Fund. The Disaster Fund Committee will make the final decision on the amount granted.

WINTER HOLIDAYS TO FLY YOUR AMERICAN FLAG

January 1: New Year's Day

At the beginning of a new year, it is important to unite as Americans as we seek another year of American greatness.

Third Monday in January: Martin Luther King Ir. Day

On this day we celebrate Dr. King's contributions to racial justice in America.

January 20: Inauguration Day

America has a proud tradition of peacefully transferring power and that is something every American can stand behind.

February 12: Lincoln's Birthday

Abraham Lincoln saved the Union and ended slavery. On this day we honor his legacy.

February 22: Washington's Birthday

George Washington defined what it meant to be an American president. One this day we show our appreciation for the nation's first president.

Third Monday in February: Presidents' Day

Our presidents represent our country and lead us through challenges. On Presidents' Day, we remember their great contributions and leadership.

SPRING HOLIDAYS TO FLY YOUR AMERICAN FLAG

April 6: Army Day

On this day we give thanks to all servicemen in the American Army.

Second Sunday in May: Mother's Day

Our mothers are the reason we are here in America and get to enjoy the freedoms that come with being an American. On this day we give thanks to all mothers in America.

May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day





Department of Minnesota April 2025 Unit Mailing Legislation Chairman, Linda Kelly

I was so privileged to attend the Washington DC legislation conference. Minnesota's American Legion Family had 18 members in attendance. Our team divided up the Senators and Representatives and I joined Legion members in visiting three of our representatives. I found them understanding of the American Legion Family's priorities and I feel that we can count on their support. Representatives were given a "Be the One" pin, which one immediately added to her lapel. She had not heard of this program was about and was very interested in the concept.

I was required to submit a report about my time in Washington DC. It asked us to mention something we learned there. I discovered many new facts, but two that bothered me the most is that not much more than half of our veterans have registered with the VA for benefits and the processing of claims and appeals needs improvement. They talked about new ways to improve these. The "Be the One" and the "buddy check" are both important. The number of veteran suicides per day has grown since the last time I heard the number. It is up to 24 per day - another sad new fact.

I also attended the VA&R Commission and learned many things. One VA department representative spoke of new immersive technology that the VA has been developing for treatment for PTSD and pain management, among other issues. It is a programmable unit where the veteran wears a goggle headset to offset medical/emotional issues they may have. A recording of one "senior" user spoke about how it has helped her lower back pain that she has had since serving our country many years ago. One type of this device is in the veteran's home so they can use it at their convenience and do not need to go into a VA facility, which is important as many of our veterans need to travel to get to a VA facility. Several of the Auxiliary members in attendance thought it would be a great project for our units - another new fact. Visit www.innovation.va.gov to learn more about their pilot programs.

Our National Commanders and President spoke. We heard from the recently appointed Secretary of the VA. I also had the opportunity to attend the Samsung Scholarship Presentation. Jessica Jensen from Anoka, one of our 2024 Girls Staters was a recipient.

It is much easier this year to submit for the Salute to Servicemember Award. An ALA member/entity simply makes the nomination, rather than the servicemember, effectively telling the story of why they feel this person is "head and shoulders" above their peers and worthy of this award. A simple narrative (no more than 1000 words), a picture of the servicemember (preferably official Department of Defense photograph), and the endorsement from their command group are the only requirements. Submissions are due June 1, 2025! The nomination form is online now. Simply click: https://www.legion-aux.org/Salute-to-Servicewomen-Award.

This award acknowledges the servicemember's contributions that goes beyond their military career, displaying their impact on their community. Launched in February 2003, Ready is a National public service campaign designed to educate and empower the American people to prepare for, respond to and mitigate emergencies and disasters. The goal of the campaign is to promote preparedness through public involvement. This website is full of information about disasters and emergencies. Make a plan, practice your plan with your family/household, and consider specific needs in your household. These needs could be:

- Dietary needs
- Medical needs including prescriptions and equipment
- Disabilities or access and functional needs including devices and equipment
- Languages spoken
- Cultural and religious considerations
- Pets or service animals
- Households with school-aged children

Ready asks individuals to do four key things:

- Stay informed about the different types of emergencies that could occur and their appropriate responses.
- Make a family emergency plan.
- Build an emergency supply kit.
- Get involved in your community by taking action to prepare for emergencies.

Poppy Funds – By the Book! Submitted by Eastern Division Chairman Carole Baldwin

POPPY FUNDS MAY BE USED FOR:

- For the rehabilitation of veterans honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces after April 6, 1917, or for the welfare of their immediate families.
- For the rehabilitation of military personnel hospitalized and awaiting discharge, who require treatment in service hospitals.
- For the benefit of veterans, active military personnel, and their families during the specified period, where financial and medical needs are evident.
- For poppy kits and supplies used to create symbolic poppies and related items for donations to the poppy fund.

POPPY FUNDS CAN NOT BE USED FOR:

- Any general operating fund of a department, unit, or post.
- Any community service project that does not strictly benefit the welfare of an individual veteran/military servicemember or the welfare of his/her family.
- General maintenance, beautification, or improvement projects of American Legion or Auxiliary families, including adding ramps to a post home.
- Investments, even those that would bring profit to the unit or post.
- POW/MIA programs.
- Memberships, including other veteran support organizations such as Gold Star Mothers. •Contributions to, or payout from the Auxiliary Emergency Fund.
- ALA Girls State/ALA Girls Nation fees.
- Flags or flagpoles.
- Scholarships, which do not restrict eligibility solely to military service members or their children, or where financial need is not evident.

- Mileage, travel, or lodging expenses; registration of conference fees; or costs incurred by a person including ALA members, volunteers, and staff to attend any meeting, conference, or event, even about veterans, military, or any other topic.
- Attire or uniforms used by volunteers or staff in promoting or conducting ALA program activity or business


