MEMORIAL DAY AND FLAG IN MOURNING

Most people know that Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May to honor the men and women who died while serving their country in the U.S. Military. History tells us that it was originally known as Decoration Day as it commenced in the years following the Civil War. Did you know it officially became a federal holiday in 1971? Memorial Day programs are held across the country to pay tribute to our fallen military. What does your Unit include in your program? Perhaps the POW/MIA Empty Chair service, singing patriotic songs and readings of poems, and a speaker. It is an opportune time to explain the meaning and history of a "flag in mourning." Old Glory is a proud symbol of patriotism. It can also be used to commemorate a time of mourning. Explaining when and how to fly the flag in mourning is an important way to respect our country and the values it represents.

We hear the term "half-staff" when we fly the flag in times of mourning. It refers to a flag positioned one-half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff. Half-staff is a tradition that goes back to the 18th century. The earliest documentation was in 1799. The Navy Department directed all ships to lower their flags to half-staff upon the death of George Washington. President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1954 expanded the practice beyond the military with a presidential proclamation for all government buildings to be included in flags at half-staff. The half-staff commemorates the death of principal figures of the U.S. government or the governor of a state or territory. Our U.S. law gives the President of the United States authority to order a nation-wide half-staffing as a mark of respect for special events as well.

There are six specific dates for the flag to be flown half-staff. They are:

- Peace Officers Memorial Day (May 15)
- Memorial Day (Last Monday in May)
- Korean War Veterans Day (July 27)
- Patriot Day (September 11)
- National Firefighters Memorial Day (First Sunday in October)
- Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day (December 7)

The National Flag Foundation (from which this information came from) provides the following information on how long the flag is flown half-staff.

- 30 days upon the death of the President or a former President.
- 10 days upon the death of the Vice President or the speaker of the House of Representatives.
- On the day of death and the following day for a member of Congress.
- Memorial Day from sunrise to noon and then it is flown at full staff.

• Peace Officers Memorial Day, Korean War Veterans Day, Patriot Day, National Firefighters Day, Memorial Day, and Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day from sunrise to sunset.

To be notified of when the flag is to be flown at half-staff, sign up for the Flag Alert e-newsletter at legion.org/newsletters or subscribe to the Flag Alert text notifications. First, text Flag to 534466. You will receive a text asking for a valid email address for the two-step authorization. Once that is complete, you will receive the text alerts. (information from legion.org)

If you have the opportunity to attend the "Veterans on the Hill" event, take it!!!!

Wednesday, April 9th was Minnesota's day. Hundreds of veterans, spouses, families, Auxiliary and SAL members attended this event. Not only was it informative, but it was impressive and just AWESOME.

After a box lunch served at the Armory just SE of the Capitol by the DAV, a short program was held. We were reminded of the CTF's (Commanders Task Force) priorities this year. This group meets monthly and discusses what we would like our legislators to do for our veterans and their families. We heard about a state program recently developed to help feed our veterans experiencing food insecurity.

We even practiced for our voices to be heard in the rotunda. Our signs read "TAKE ACTION" and when our speaker said "TAKE", we all responded with "ACTION". We even practiced BOOING.

The group then walked to our Veterans Building and when everyone had gathered, they marched to the Capitol Building, up the steps and into the Rotunda of the Capitol. It was packed with people on the 2nd and 3rd floors balconies, too. We heard from the DAV, Governor Walz, American Legion Commander Moon, and several members of our MN House of Representatives. They all seemed supportive of our priorities, but there was some booing.

We had a 103-year-old World War II veteran with us – up front and center. He received a loud round of applause.

Our practicing at the Armory paid off. Our "ACTION" and booing resounded throughout the rotunda, and I swear it went all the way to the top. They got our message.

MN Membership Member-opoly Report

I hope everyone is enjoying the erratic weather. I personally prefer sunny and 60 over the snow and wind.

So, what has been going on in our Membership Race since we last talked?

We have a pretty tight race going for the top 3 places in our Districts. District 6 is still holding 1st place with a mere .82% lead over District 3 with 91.46%. Sneaking up on them is District 1 following behind by a slight .38%. This could get to be a nail-biter.

There is an .89% difference in Districts 2, 9 and 7. Then we have a .76% difference in Districts 10 and 8. And still in the game we have Districts 4 & 5.

But even with how close our numbers seem, we are still down 817 members from this time last year. Membership renewals have been sent out from National, and everyone has been making calls trying to get our unpaid members to renew.

When I put out the call for help in February to reach the 85% National Membership Goal, everyone dug in and helped me pull it off. Now we can easily meet the remaining 4 goals needed to watch President Judy walk across the stage in Tampa, FL, in August 2025.

I want to ask that we keep that momentum going. I know that we have many things going on right now like reports, holidays, conferences and conventions. Trust me, I know! But these are good things. There are people at most of these events! Make new contacts, reach out to old contacts, find new juniors. There are so many people that we talk to every day that don't even know that they are eligible. It's time to find them.

We have several more Department Award goals coming up. I know we can make them if we make another push. Here are the goals and the upcoming dates.

<u>Award dates on the horizon:</u> 95% Department Award Deadline – May 23, 2025 Recruit/Rejoin 10 Award Deadline – June 1, 2025 100% Department Award Deadline – July 4, 2025 102% Department Award Deadline – July 26, 2025

Interestingly - a recent report was run by our outstanding National Membership Team - which identified 170 members across ALL Divisions where the HLM (Honorary Life Member) is showing as 'Unpaid'.

Few reminders and take away notes:

- 1. HLM (Honorary Life Members) annual dues should be on the 1st transmittal submitted for processing each year!!!!
- 2. Units are responsible for paying any HLMs on their roster.
- 3. Please notify your Department Membership Processor with a data change form should the status of an Honorary Life Member need to be updated or changed.
- 4. The Member with HLM status depends on the Unit to pay their dues annually, keep in mind their ALA benefits could be affected if not current.

If you have any questions on Honorary Life Members (HLM)s, please refer to the Unit Guidebook and/or reach out to your Department Membership Processing team for assistance; your Division Chairs are here to assist with questions if needed.

In the Divisional Race, the Northwestern Division is currently in last place with 87.36%. Minnesota is 3rd place out of 7 in the Northwestern Division at 87.71%. Colorado and Wyoming are now in the lead and South Dakota stays close behind us.

Elections will be held in the next couple of months at your meetings, Roberts Rules of Order has guidelines to follow for elections. I would like to thank Norma Tramm for allowing me to use this article she wrote in 2022.

Many units will have elections at the May meeting. I would like to share the process with you. Several of you have been President many times and do not need any information, but there may be a few Presidents that will be having elections for the first time.

It is important to have the nominating committee report before the election. Then the Chair (President) must call for further nominations from the floor for the elected offices.

The following format is taken from Robert's Rules of Order:

Chair: For President______ is nominated by the nominating committee. Are there any further nominations for President? (If a member nominated another person, the chair repeats the name and that person) _______ is nominated . Are there any further nominations?

It is not Necessary to repeat three times., you just need to be certain that there are no more nominations. The Chair (President) states the following: Chair: Are there any further nomination for President?...(pause).. If not...(pause), nominations are closed for the office of President.

Next

For First Vice President,______ is nominated by the nominating committee. Are there any further nominations for First Vice President? (If a member nominates another pers, the chair repeats the name of the person)______ is nominated. Are there any further nominations?

It is not necessary to repeat three times, you just need to be certain that there are no more nominations. The Chair (President) stated the following: Chair: are there any further nominations for First Vice president? (pause).. If not ...(pause), nominations are closed for the office of First Vice President.

Continue in the same manner with the remainder of the Elected Offices.

Second Vice President Treasurer Sergeant-at-Arms Two members of the Executive Committee (can be done at the same time)

This should complete the list of officers to be elected.

If you have more than one candidate for an office you will need to elect, usually by ballot. All members including the President should be given a ballot. The president will appoint election tellers. Once the process is complete the chairman of the tellers will report the results of the ballot. The President will then declare the results for the office.

Most of the time there will only be one candidate for each office.

To Elect the President should state the following:

"_____ has been nominated for the office of president. As many as are in favor of ______ for President say aye Those opposed say no The ayes have it and ______ is elected President."

If the noes are in the majority the wording is:

"The noes have it and ______ is not elected." (This is not likely when you only have one candidate).

This should be repeated for each office that is elected:

First Vice President Second Vice President Treasurer Sergeant-at-Arms Executive Committee

Should the president give up the chair for elections if her name is on the Ballot???

NO – she still should facilitate the election even when stating her name for an office.

You may feel it a waste of time to do the election part when you have members who have consented to hold the office. IT IS MY OPINION that the process if election is important, it says to the elected officers that the members wish to have them hold the office because they voice their opinion by saying yes. It also gives the members a satisfaction that they have actually elected the people who will be in charge of leading the unit for the next year.

Many units will hold an installation ceremony, failure to conduct the ceremony doesn't affect the time at which the term commences, nor does it prohibit the candidate from assuming the office.

All officers will assume their elected and appointed office at the conclusion of the Department Convention in July.

It is the privilege and responsibility of the President to make appointments. This is true of all levels of the American Legion Auxiliary. This is soooo important for the life and continued advancement of our organization.

A member who is given an appointment should be made to feel that they are in charge of the program and will not be questioned each time they suggest a new idea. It is good to make appointments according to a persons' strength that can further the goals of the American Legion Auxiliary.

I want to congratulate each on their election of new officers for the coming year. To outgoing officers' congratulations on the Auxiliary year that you have just finished. To the newly elected officers' congratulations on being elected to your office.

Thank you to everyone for all you do for the American Legion Auxiliary and our veterans and their families.

This has been a year of learning more about the Memorial Flower the "Poppy". In World War I the poppy came to symbolize the bloodshed by those who fought and those who continue to fight for our Country. The Poppy became the memorial flower of The American Legion on September 27th, 1920, in Cleveland, Ohio.

Poppy Day is celebrated in countries around the world. In 2017, The American Legion brought National Poppy Day to the United States by asking Congress to designate the Friday before Memorial Day as National Poppy Day. That is how it officially became that day. Support the living National Poppy Day is the Friday before Memorial Day.

Does your Unit have plans for Memorial Day? to Honor the fallen? Remember: Poppies are not sold by volunteers, they are distributed. Ask them if they would like to wear a poppy, if asked what they cost tell them nothing it is a way to honor the fallen. We are more than willing to take any donations offered.

Identify a specific purpose for which you are collecting your poppy money. For example, maybe you want to make \$1500 for Honor Flights so more Veterans and their helpers can attend.
